God does Not Tell the Truth

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To believe in a word, a prophecy, an inspiration, a vision or a dream, it is of foremost imperative that one be able to trust in the absolute veracity of the God undergirding that thing.

Many people feel they have to say, "I'm telling you the truth", when they desire to establish an important point.

The fact that they are differentiating on this issue of conversation, reveals that their honesty on other things they have said, may now be suspect.

Only people who sometimes lie, deceive, obfuscate or subterfuge, feel it necessary to define when their words "should be trusted."

Numbers 23:19

"God is not a man, that He should lie, Nor a son of man, that He should repent; Has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?

Peace arises when absolute truth is on the line, and is totally trustworthy in every aspect.

Psalm 119:160

The sum of Your word is truth, And every one of Your righteous ordinances is everlasting.

John 14:27

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Colossians 3:15

And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful.

Fear, worry and torment enter in, when one is not sure they can trust the word, honor, promise of the one who has assured them.

Nehemiah 9:6

"You alone are the LORD You have made the heavens, The heaven of heavens with all their host, The earth and all that is on it, The seas and all that is in them You give life to all of them And the heavenly host bows down before You.

Philippians 4:7

and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Peace is the product of absolute trust bringing full assurance.

Joshua 23:14

"Behold, this day I am going the way of all the earth. And you know in all your hearts and in all your souls that not one thing has failed of all the good things which the LORD your God spoke concerning you. All have come to pass for you; not one word of them has failed.

Isaiah 26:3

You will keep him in perfect peace, Whose mind is stayed on You, Because he trusts in You.

A word from a person of trust allows one to get their hope up, so they can get their faith on, and enter into expectation.....

John 17:17

" Sanctify them in the truth; Your word is truth.

Isaiah 40:8

The grass withers, the flower fades, But the word of our God stands forever."

Whether word, prophecy, dream or vision, it must be underwritten by absolute trust, producing trust.

1 Kings 8:56

"Blessed *be* the LORD, who has given rest to His people Israel, according to all that He promised. There has not failed one word of all His good promise, which He promised through His servant Moses.

Joshua 21:45

Not one of the good promises which the LORD had made to the house of Israel failed; all came to pass.

Joshua 23:14

"Behold, this day I am going the way of all the earth. And you know in all your hearts and in all your souls that not one thing has failed of all the good things which the LORD your God spoke concerning you. All have come to pass for you; not one word of them has failed.

God does not "tell the truth"!

If he tells the truth, He is reciting something not of Himself. Truth is "of God", not told by God. If He can tell a truth, the question arises, can He tell something that is not totally trustworthy? If He "tells the truth", where does that truth come from? Is truth separate from God?

Psalm 86:10

For You are great and do wondrous deeds; You alone are God.

Can we fully trust His words to us, and for us?

Philippians 1:6

being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ;

Do we see Him as one with His word?

Psalm 119:89

Forever, O LORD, Your word is settled in heaven.

Can we ever separate Him, His nature, His acts, from His word and its absolute truth?

John 4:24

God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

When God speaks, He releases truth, He reveals another element of His nature, His purpose, His power.

John 7:18

He who speaks from himself seeks his own glory; but He who seeks the glory of the One who sent Him is true, and no unrighteousness is in Him.

When He speaks truth, He speaks of Himself.

God is truth, not tells the truth-It is all yes, and amen -

Revelation 15:4

" Who will not fear, O Lord, and glorify Your name? For You alone are holy; For ALL THE NATIONS WILL COME AND WORSHIP BEFORE YOU, FOR YOUR RIGHTEOUS ACTS HAVE BEEN REVEALED."

Faith requires Truth as its foundation.

Truth engenders trust in what was said.

Faith and Truth = one - inseparable
